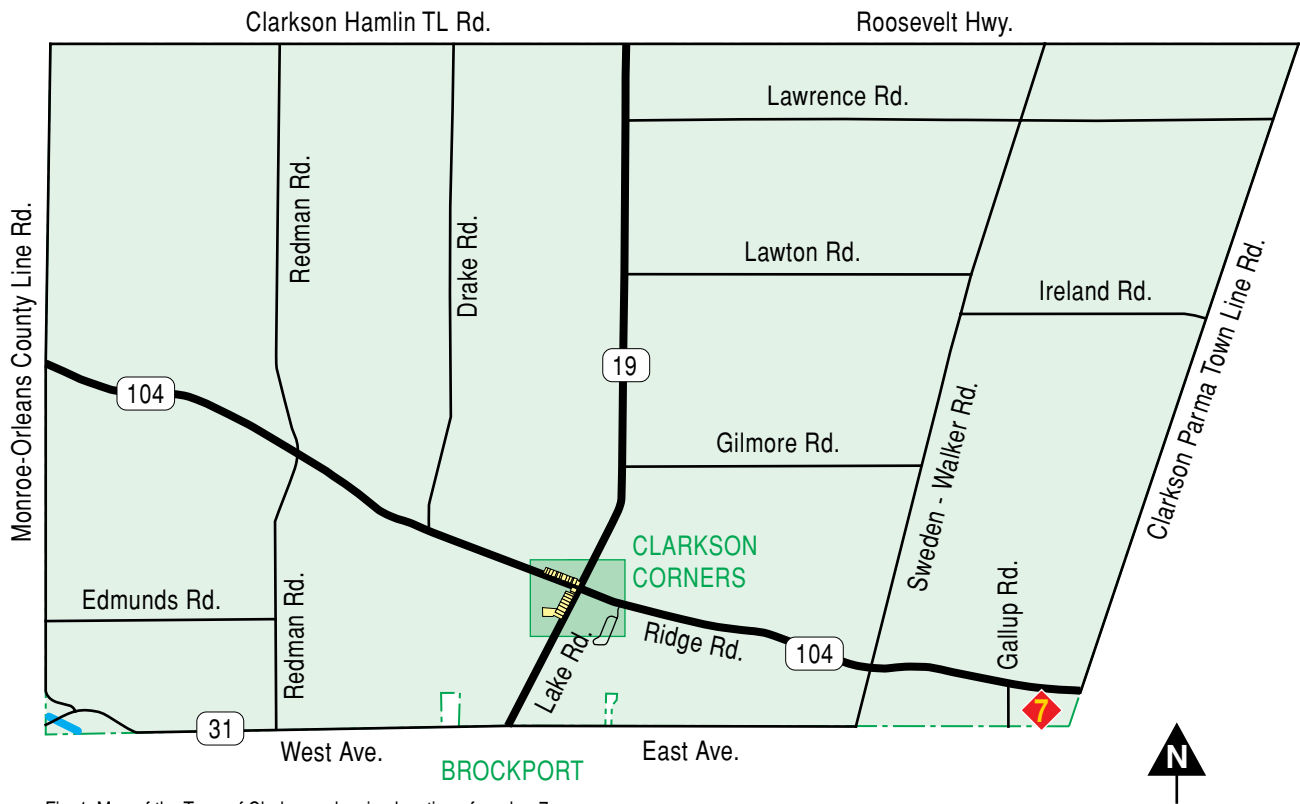


Fig. 1. Map of the Town of Clarkson, showing location of marker 7.

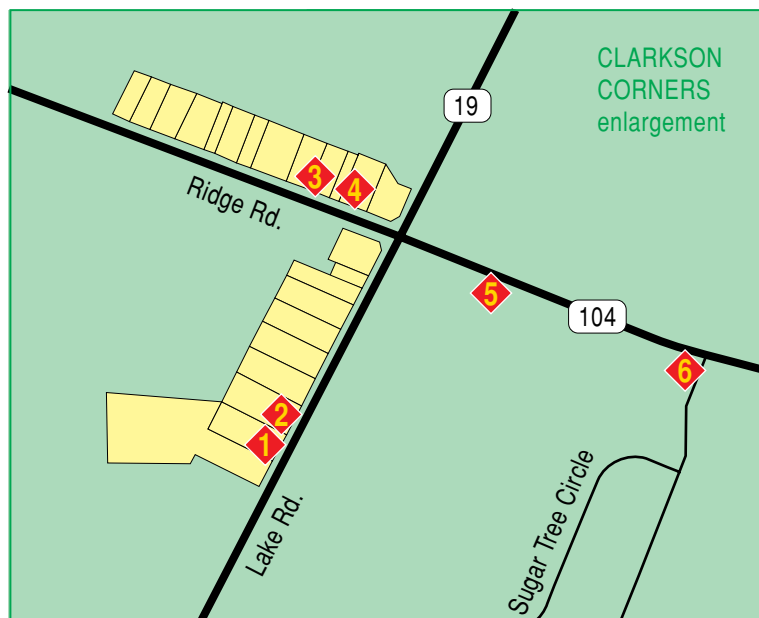
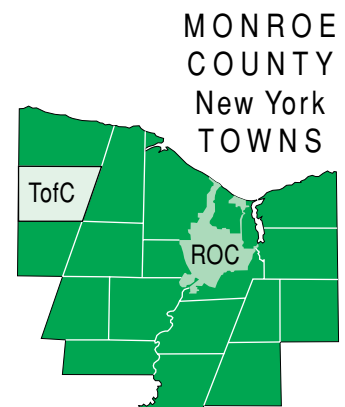


Fig. 2. Enlarged section of Figure 1 showing location of known markers at Clarkson Corners

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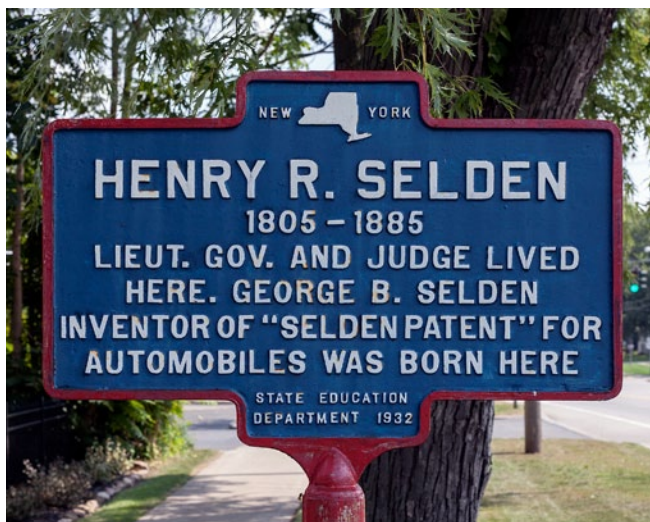

Clarkson's first pioneer church.
Oldest church on Ridge Road west
of the Genesee River, in Monroe
County. Organized as a Congre-
gational Society in 1816.
Erected 1825. Dedicated 1828.
Clarkson's original academy burned
1852; replaced by adjacent brick
school house.
